- 1. Apologies for Absence Steve Marriott, Ian McDonald, Jenny McDonald
- 2. There were no error or omissions . The acceptance of the minutes was proposed by Alec Fraser and seconded by Alan Chapman and the minutes were approved unanimously with 27 votes for 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.
- 3. Matters arising from those minutes

a. Open Evening

CB reported that this was missed out at the beginning of the season but it could be included in a member's evening. More thought needs to be given to it and advertised.

Action: RL to consider whether this was suitable for CCC.

b. Payment Structure

CB stated that we don't want to change this. It has been looked at and a new all year round scheme was introduced which 9 members have taken up.

Action: Complete

c. Attract new members.

RL and BFC have had several discussions but their thoughts were that the CRV checks (to work with children) would prove too onerous. It was decided not to pursue this approach.

Action: Complete

d. Sustainable member

AC and CB have discussed this issue and decided that what CCC have in place is very adequate.

Action: Complete.

e. Does the CCC want a portrait group.

Tom Peacock asked if there was any interest in the club for a portrait group.

CB has investigated and there seems to be some interest in the club but he has so far been unable to find someone who would actually run the group.

Action CB – Complete

4. Treasurer's report and presentation and approval of the annual accounts.

CB ask MC to comment on the Annual accounts.

MC said that he had circulated his report and the Income and Expenses Report for the year ending March 2023 and there had not been any comments. MC said that, after our economic difficulties, we are a smaller group but we are fine. Note that some camera clubs had closed e.g. Rayleigh.

There were no further questions on the reports however there was some discussion about whether a £20 float could be kept at the admission door. AP thought this was a useful idea but CB requested that people try and bring the right monies.

CB thanked MC

The Treasurer's Report and Accounts were approved unanimously with 27 votes for, 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.

5. Officers' Reports: Proposed by the President that the reports be dealt with in their entirety and then voted upon. This year all of the Officers' Reports have been emailed to members in advance so that they can read them prior to the AGM and have any questions they wish answered. There were no questions in advance, butr in response to a question from the floor, AC explained the purpose of CCC's new Facebook page (showing winning entries and events) and how the new ensuing link would allow members into the private area for just members only.

6. Members to vote on accepting the Officers' Reports.

The Officers' Reports were approved unanimously with 27 votes for, 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.

7. Chairman's Report

The Chairman's report was read out by Mike Leonard.

This is my third year of tenure as Chairman and I am pleased to say the club continues to present to its members a wide array of speakers from various genres of photography, whilst mixing this with members events and competitions both print and PDI. Whilst we have seen some new faces to the club, the membership continues to be down on its previous highs of a few years ago, and as a club we need to find ways to encourage the growth of our membership. Our financial position the previous year had deteriorated as we used funds through the COVID period to ensure the club kept running to its high standards and through the good offices of the committee agreed a stringent budget for the season to help try and put ourselves back in balance. It was also our 70th anniversary which we celebrated by inviting Joe Cornish to the newly revamped Cramphorn theatre, and the proceeds from this event, plus the efforts of everyone involved help redress the majority of the funds eroded out over the previous couple of seasons.

There are various events organised during the summer period, with trips to motocross and various other days out, Photo trek set by last year's winner Dave Purkiss, together with the BBQ being held by Pat and Melvyn. Enough to keep the trigger fingers happy and active.

Colin Birch has responded to some of the members questions this year which concerned competitions. The competition structure and rules which surround them is a complicated issue and has been debated endlessly. It would be unsuitable to re start the debate at the AGM, but I am preparing to present to the next committee a suggestion which may satisfy all members and if approved will approach the membership across the summer for consideration.

In the meantime, it is only right for me to suggest the club continues to operate successfully principally due to a hugely committed group of volunteers. We as members, and particularly myself as chairman are indebted to these individuals who compose the committee and put untold effort, energy and diligence into the well-being of the club, and on behalf of all the membership and myself offer our extreme gratitude to these individuals and my own personal thank you.

I look forward to seeing everyone again next season.

The President thanked Mike Leonard.

8. Year 2023/2024 subscriptions: The committee proposes that the 2023/2024 subscriptions will be as follows. Annual membership £35 for all members, no concessions or Family membership, normal Thursday entrance fee of £3.

Proposer and Seconder are not required as this was proposed by the committee.

The 2023/2024 subscriptions are approved unanimously with 27 votes for, 0 votes against and 0 abstention.

9. Membership Renewal: Existing members are requested to rejoin by the end of the summer break as we would like to be able to offer places to new members in September.

MC stated he will be sending out the renewal and GDPR email imminently and asked everyone to check their information. He requested that people renew their membership via bank transfer where possible.

10. President's Remarks 2023

Ray has covered the Club's year so I would like to give a vote of thanks to him as our Chairman and to the committee as a whole who have worked so hard to ensure everything has run smoothly. Sally Freeman is leaving us this year so a special thank you to her for all the work as External Competition Secretary.

Congratulations too, to Steve Marriott and Ian McDonald on gaining their CPAGB awards. I would like to encourage everyone to think about going for either PAGB, RPS or FIAP awards and we will try to provide more information in the coming season. In fact, the EAF is putting on an Advisory Day near Cambridge on 3rd September for those considering going for a PAGB award. You can take along images for advice or just go along to see what quality of image is required. For those interested, go to the EAF website or have a word with me for details.

One request I would like to make is for help on the committee. If you feel able to give some of your time it would be really appreciated.

CB committed to ensuring new members were able to view previous portfolios of members and also reinstate the weekly print displays of member's work. AC said that he was willing to help show SM's and IM's recent CPAGB successes (dpi) on a members evening.

Finally, have a good summer, take lots of pictures, don't forget the PhotoTrek and I hope to see you at the BBQ at Pat and Melvyn's on 12th August.

11. Election of the President.

The meeting was then handed over to Mike Leonard, the Vice Chairman, to conduct this election.

Mike said that as there were no other counter proposals Colin Birch was re-elected as President.

12. Election of Officers and Ordinary Committee Members.

This doesn't exceed the maximum number so Colin Birch proposed that the whole committee is re-elected together.

The new Committee was duly elected with 26 votes for 0 votes against and 1 abstention.

John Shears raised a question about the absence of RL at the weekly meetings and the AGM. CB explained that RL had explained the situation to the committee and that he would be away from the weekly meetings only during April, May and September.

ML was asked if he wished to take over from RL but ML said he would rather wait another year to gain experience and take over the chairmanship at the next AGM.

Helen Edwards asked what were the 'areas in the air' that were referred to the chairman's speech. CB replied that there were areas in the competition rules that needed 'smoothing over'.

13. Auditor

Barry Collin has kindly agreed to audit the 2023-34 accounts.

14. Changes to the constitution.

Members were asked to vote on the following change to the constitution:-

'16 DISSOLUTION: The Club may be dissolved by the members at an Extra Ordinary General Meeting held after at least four weeks notice and the resolution shall only be deemed passed if more than three quarters of the votes cast are in favour. In the event of dissolution of the club, subject to there being no debtors or creditors for settlement which would ordinarily be organised paid and collected as a priority, any residual funds in either current account or savings accounts, plus the funds from any saleable assets, once realised, will be distributed equally between two charities, the British Heart Foundation and Cancer UK.

Any residual equipment will be offered to other local camera clubs.'

CB said that these words were fairly standard words copied from other clubs (e.g. EAF) and it was something we should have already have in place.

There were comments made about whether the club was being disbanded, whether it was a legal requirement or that the information letter had been terse and not explained that the club was financially OK. CB reiterated that the committee felt this was necessary but not a legal requirement. The trigger had been the fact that during Covid some clubs had folded. The choice of the charities had been solely the committee's.

The change was approved with 26 votes for, 0 votes against and 1 abstention.

15. Answers to members' written questions.

There have been three very reasonable questions raised ahead of the AGM

The first question concerns lack of information on competitions such as what the competition is about, hand-in dates, etc.

A lot of this information disappeared when we cut back on the printed programme but it is available on the website. It will be reinstated for next season's programme and explanations added to the website to describe each competition. This is currently included in the Welcome Pack for new members but could use some expansion and improvement which will be done.

The other two questions both concern modified images using packages such as Photoshop and suggest that they are judged separately to be fair to those people without these skills.

There are two problems with this:

Firstly, although some creative images are clearly modified, there are other images, creative or quite normal-looking, which have been heavily modified but you would never know, and this used to be the case in darkroom days, too.

Secondly, there are other genres where particular skills would give advantages to some people, e.g. sports, wildlife, portraits, etc. and there will be calls to separate these out as well.

We already provide separate competitions in the Annual Awards for different genres but I don't think this is the way forward for normal competitions throughout the season.

However, if we also take into account the concerns over frequent use of images, there are two things that we can do now. Firstly, for the coming season, we propose to apply the rules on reuse of images to entries into all competitions during the season, not just to entries into the league. This would smooth out any reuse and avoid overuse, and don't forget that any image can be used in the Annual Awards in addition to competitions during the season. Secondly, the committee will consider what might be done to change the format of league competitions for future seasons. This requires a bit more thought so we will keep you updated."

Action: Committee

a) Diptych – Tom plucinski suggested that as there doesn't seem to be enough panel of 6 entries then why don't we have a Diptych competition as well.
b)

Action: Committee

b) Tea and front desk rota – Liz Croxson thanked Jenny McDonald and Clare Price for stepping in to carry out the tea rota and did a great job.

CB said that next season Jenny McDonald would be in charge of the rotas and would be asking members (individually) to put their names on the list.

c) Mike Rose commented that he Broomfield hospital gallery still refers to Moulsham Mill. CB apologised and said it was on his outstanding list of actions.

d) Melvyn Frewin asked what it the committee doing to raise the membership numbers since Covid.

CB said that we are still thinking about an Open Evening and the programmes are distributed around so that people can just pick them up. AP said we'd had an article in AP and City News and an EAF bulletin article in June 2022. We also had a 4C's article in last December's the Bulletin.

CB said we've also got our new Social Media platform, but all new ideas are welcome.

e) Melvyn Frewin asked about the lack of the library exhibition. MC said that we asked 3 years of new members if their membership had originated from the library and it had not.

f) Dave Purkiss suggested using a presence at big events like Blackwater show. This is what Maldon club had done and obtained 20 new members.

g) Dave Purkiss suggested inviting U3A members for a few weeks, CB said that he had run an introduction course to photography over the season and invited U3A members who were better attended than the Club members. [Post meeting note - I will invite U3A members]

I) CB asked members to send him an email with ideas on recruitment.

Meeting finished at 21.07.

PDI SECRETARY'S REPORT END OF 2022-23 SEASON

As last year, only the top two preferences from each competitor were shown in each competition. This gave approximately 78 images to be judged each competition night. The exception to this was the themed competition where 3 images per person were used and led to 99 images to be judged.

The usual rules for the league competition applied, i.e., an entrant's best mark for each competition was retained and the best 5 of these 'bests' was used to determine the final league position.

PDI LEAGUE COMPETITION 2022-2023

Level 1

This Season there will be 4 relegations from level 1 to level 2

2 of these had not recorded any scores during the season, with 1 further user only entering 2 competitions.

Therefore, with a Level 1 Membership of 19 members, and a participation of 17 Members this produced a Participation rate of **89.5%**

Level 2

This season there will be 6 Members Promoted from Level 2 to Level 1

As per Club Rules there will be no relegations from Level 2 to Level 3

Therefore, with a Level 2 Membership of 41 members, and a participation of 19 Members this produced a Participation rate of **46.3%**

Level 3

There will be 2 Members this season Promoted from Level 3 to Level 2

Therefore, with a Level 3 Membership of 11 members, and a participation of 3 Members this produced a Participation rate of **27.3%**

Treasurer's Report for AGM


Year End Accounts at 31 March 2023

The total sum in our bank and cash accounts is £7995 The Income & Expense summary shows a surplus of £2005

Note that the surplus includes income from the Joe Cornish event, which a one-off bonus. The surplus without the effect of the Joe Cornish event is ± 1005 - this is still healthy, and demonstrates that the increase in attendance fees coupled with the economies implemented at the start of the year have reversed the downturn in our financial situation.

Membership is 72 - down 30% from pre-Covid levels. Average weekly attendance is 32 – down 35% from pre-Covid levels.

Now that we are free of the effects of Covid we can understand the income we have to work with. Membership and attendance fees (with the relatively minor contribution from the raffle) are the only significant sources of income but, with the economies we implemented this year, we have a viable club. Note that a number of clubs have folded over the last couple of years as a result of falling membership, but we have weathered the storm and have a financial model which should see us through the foreseeable future few years, Also, note that expenditure on judges, speakers and refreshments has been protected, so you should see no degradation in the quality of our weekly meetings.
