- 1. Apologies for Absence: Tom Peacock, Liz Croxson
- 2. Approval of the minutes.

There were no error or omissions. The acceptance of the minutes was proposed by Mike Leonard and seconded by Ian McDonald and the minutes were approved unanimously with 25 votes for 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.

3. Matters arising from those minutes.

- a. Open Evening RL to consider whether this would be suitable for CCC. Action: RL The idea of an open evening was discussed and the conclusion was that to have a dedicated evening instead of one of the normal Thursday evenings would be problematic for existing members and would not attract enough prospective members to make it worthwhile. Instead, we should take advantage of the variety in the normal programme and suggest a suitable combination of evenings for each individual prospective member to attend. They could also be put in touch with existing members who share the same interests or have relevant expertise. Attracting new members in the first place requires a combination of initiatives such as the exhibition stand in Remembrance Square, distribution of programmes to as many outlets as possible, having a presence at local venues and events and featuring in published media. Use of Social Media is working well and we have had publicity in Amateur Photographer, the EAF Bulletin and City News and a display of images in Broomfield Hospital. We attended the Steam Punk Fair in Maldon and have our current exhibition in The Art Place but this is a continuing activity and other possibilities arise and are assessed for suitability. Contact has also been made to other organisations such as the local U3A.
- **b. Use of images and competition structure.** Committee to limit the use of images to spread reuse and avoid overuse and to consider the structure of league competitions.

Action: Committee

The rules on reuse of images were applied to entries into all competitions during the season, not just to entries into the league and this improved the situation. As a reminder, a

high-scoring image can only be used once. If it scores less than 18 or does not achieve a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place it can be used once more in another season. Note that any image can also be used in the Annual Awards in addition to competitions during the season. Considerable debate took place on the structure of competitions and finally the option for members to enter a themed set of competitions modelled on the Amateur Photographer annual competition was proposed. This offered a choice to members, allowing those happy with the current format to continue with it and those who were looking for more of a challenge to opt for a set of themed competitions. This was proposed to members but there was insufficient interest to make the approach viable. The existing structure will therefore continue.

c. Add a diptych competition for the Panel of Six evening. Action: Committee

A Panel of Two competition was added on the Panel of Six competition evening and it went well. There were only five panels of six prints, however, even fewer than last year, so it was decided to curtail this competition and add the Panel of Two to the Panel of Three competition evening, giving a full evening's entertainment.

4. Treasurer's report and presentation and approval of the annual accounts. See Appendix 2

MC can not be here tonight but we wish him well with his current issue with his wife. His report says we have lost quite a lot of members since the pandemic, now at 69 ish, we would like to see some more members.

The financial situation was very difficult after the pandemic but we managed to make a surplus this year, which will give us a buffer, and this means that we can spend a little more money on speakers and judges, and hopefully we will get some good and different speakers.

There were no questions about the reports so CB thanked MC and BC for the audit. The acceptance of the reports was proposed by Trevor Sadowski and seconded by Bas Patel and the reports were approved unanimously with 25 votes for 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.

- **5. Officers' Reports:** (Proposed by the President that the reports be dealt with in their entirety and then voted upon.) This year all of the Officers' Reports have been emailed to members in advance, CB asked if there were any questions on the reports, there were no questions.
- 6. Members to vote on Officers' Reports. See Appendix 1

The acceptance of the reports was proposed by Alan Chapman and seconded by Kevin Bishop and the reports were approved unanimously with 25 votes for 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.

7. Chairman's Report.

I feel really privileged that the club accepted me as Chairman over the last four years, and despite the best attempts of the failed and painful attempt to move to Sandon, and the Considerable impact of COVID, the club continues to run an entertaining and full program for its membership.

The 75th Anniversary event with Joe Cornish last season really helped to redress the financial balance of the club, and this season has equally seen us balance the books, despite the fact the membership continues to dwindle.

We have as a club this year politely declined to participate in some external competitions, and whittled these down to a few key relationships moving forward. We owe a huge vote of thanks to Clare Price who picked up the mantle of this and together with Mike Rose and lan McDonald ensured we represented ourselves at those key events. We do however need to fill this vacancy this coming season, as Clare undertook this in addition to all the efforts of the Secretary role for the club. Volunteers would be warmly welcomed.

Steve Marriott has stepped down from the committee as membership secretary, and a deep vote of thanks goes to Steve for all his efforts (again volunteers welcome) and also thank you to Neil Crumpen who reluctantly resigned the PDI competition's role due to work commitments. Dave Purkiss has taken on this responsibility for us.

The summer months are again filled with activities, with various events organised by the wildlife Group and the R5 / R6 group which should account for everyone's varied interests, and the PhotoTrek competition has changed this year to a 10 picture event taken on your mobile phone anywhere, the only restrictions being the date range.

At the last AGM a point was made in respect of competitions and competition structure, and I did present to members an alternative which I hoped would allow a position for everyone to participate in respect of their chosen outcome. However, less than 1/3 of the current membership bothered to vote for the proposition, which clearly indicated that the proposition didn't have sufficient merit to be considered further, which on a personal note I think is a real shame.

This season heralds my last as Chairman. When I took on the role, I was expecting to be fully retired and therefore believed I could throw my all at the proposition. Alas, I managed to expand my sporting photographic hobby further than previously, which means for three, maybe four months of the camera club season I am simply not available to attend, and I don't believe this is appropriate for the club. Mike Leonard, with the support of everyone at the club has agreed to take on these responsibilities with Tom Plucinski a more than able lieutenant.

Finally, the club exists for its members, but there are a group of people that operate and run this club without whom we would not have such an engaging program, without whom frankly the club would not run, nor exist. I on behalf of every club member propose an enormous vote of thanks and gratitude to all those on the committee who give up their time, effort and seemingly boundless energy to ensure we continue to be one of the foremost Camera Clubs in the region.

Thank you for all your support over the last four years, and I hope you will be able to bestow upon Mike and Tom even greater support as they look to continue to take our great club forwards.

CB thanked RL and said that his report was well received.

8. Year 2024/2025 subscriptions. The committee proposes that the 2024/2025 subscriptions will remain as follows. Annual membership £35 for all members, no concessions or Family membership, normal Thursday entrance fee of £3. It is possible to pay for a full year's subscription and annual membership for £140. MC will be issuing information on this and GDPR within the next few days.

The acceptance of the subscriptions was proposed by Andrew Pickess and seconded by Nicola Riley

The 2024/2025 subscriptions are approved unanimously with 25 votes for, 0 votes against and 0 abstention.

9. Membership Renewal: Existing members are requested to rejoin by the end of the summer break as we would like to be able to offer places to new members in September.

10. President's remarks.

Ray has covered the Club's year so I would like to give a vote of thanks to him as our Chairman and to the committee as a whole who have worked so hard to ensure everything has run smoothly. Ray, together with Steve Marriott and Neil Crumpen are standing down

this year so a special thank you to them for all the work as Chairman, New Members Secretary and PDI Competition Secretary.

Congratulations to Ian and Jenny McDonald on gaining their DPAGB and CPAGB awards respectively and also to Steve Marriott who has just achieved his BPE1*. Distinctions are worth doing so I would like to encourage everyone to think about going for either PAGB, RPS, FIAP or BPE awards. In fact, the EAF is putting on an Advisory Day near Cambridge on 1st September for those considering going for a PAGB award. You can take along images for advice or just go along to see what quality of image is required. For those interested, go to the EAF website or have a word with me for details. EAF actually hosting an Advisory Day in 2016.

Finally, have a good summer, take lots of pictures, don't forget the PhotoTrek and I hope to see you at the Beer Festival.

11. Election of the President.

The total sum in our bank and cash accounts is £8863 The Income & Expense summary shows a surplus of £868

Membership is 69 - down 30% from pre-Covid levels, and continuing to fall. Average weekly attendance is 32 - down 35% from pre-Covid levels.

The healthy bank balance and the surplus this year demonstrates that the increase in attendance fees, coupled with the economies implemented last year, have reversed the downturn in our financial situation. This confirms that we have a viable club with a financial model which should see us through the foreseeable future few years.

We are now able to increase expenditure on Speakers and Judges for the coming season without jeopardizing our financial stability
